

First Reading —Valerie Kaur

Seeing no stranger begins in wonder. It is to look upon the face of anyone and choose to say: You are a part of me I do not know. Wonder is the wellspring of love...It is easy to wonder about the internal life of the people closest to us. It is harder to wonder about people who seem like strangers or outsiders. But when we choose to wonder about people we don't know, when we imagine their lives and listen for their stories, we begin to expand the circle of we see as part of us. We prepare ourselves to love beyond what evolution requires.

Second Reading—Henri Nouwen

True hospitality is welcoming the stranger. On her own terms. This kind of hospitality can only be offered by those who've found the center of their lives in their own hearts.

“When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. “Then the King will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.’ Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?’ “The King will reply, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’ “Then he will say to those on his left, ‘Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.’ “They also will answer, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?’ “He will reply, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.’ “Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.”





You are welcome to bring a dish to pass. Plates, silverware, and beverages provided.





The deadline to have the application submitted is May 31, 2024.

LUNDE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Available to either a male or female member of Emmanuel Lutheran Church who will be a college junior, senior, or graduate student in any area of college study.

OLSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Available to members of Emmanuel, to high school seniors, and to college students that attend a Christian church for purposes of general education, including higher education and college studies, or for any other educational purposes.

WALQUIST MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Available to members of Emmanuel, to high school seniors, and to college students who are members of a Lutheran Church in the Rockford area and who are enrolled in college studies, and for any other educational purposes.

Selections will be based on many criteria:

1. Spiritual involvement and motivation.
2. Scholastic achievement.
3. Financial need.
4. Leadership and extra-curricular activity.
5. Strength of recommendations.
6. Quality of application materials.

The Robert C. and Phyllis J. Sio Scholarship Fund

The Robert C. and Phyllis J. Sio Scholarship Fund has been established to support undergraduate education scholarships for two students at \$1,500 per student. The following general guidelines shall be used by the Emmanuel Lutheran Scholarship Committee to administer this fund:

- 1) The scholarship shall be used to support undergraduate education only.
- 2) The student must attend an accredited Christian college.
- 3) The scholarship is intended to support tuition expenses only.
- 4) Applicants shall be members of Emmanuel Lutheran Church and/or seniors at Christian Life High School, Rockford Christian High School or Rockford Lutheran High School.
- 5) Two separate scholarships of \$1,500 each will be awarded annually to two students. Grantees may receive no more than two annual scholarships.
- 6) Selections will be based on many different criteria including spiritual involvement and motivation, scholastic achievement, financial need, leadership and extra-curricular activity, strength of recommendations and quality of application materials (not necessary in that order).
- 7) A letter of notification will be sent to all applicants by the end of June.
- 8) The funds distribution will take place prior to the beginning of the grantee's fall semester and after receiving confirmation of enrollment at the college (i.e.: class schedule).
- 9) Please understand that the decisions of Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council, in granting the scholarships, will be final. The scholarship is a gift and requires no repayment. Emmanuel Lutheran Church reserves the right to publish the names of scholarship recipients in the media.
