### A May Message from Pastor Frank





The earth is greening and blooming. Have you noticed how swiftly the earth is revealing its vitality and vibrance? It seems like it has happened in just a few days. The combination of rain, and sunlight along with optimal temperatures is creating growth. This greening and blooming will yield new life, and a harvest to come. I walk, wander, and wonder upon the land and among earth's beings. I am intentional about this practice rather than getting caught up in or distracted by the many things that are involved in living and working.

I walk on the land several times a week, but also when I step out into my backyard, or walk my dogs down the street. There are times when I can wander and wonder without physically walking as I sit looking out a window. When I do so I will open the window, if I am able to do so, to allow the sounds, sights, and smells of the wild world to be present.

I wander as a walk, or as I sit in the presence of the wild world. Wandering happens when I let myself be guided by either my intuition, or by a sense within my body. For example, if I am walking and I come to where the trail splits, I will turn in a way that feels "curious." I may notice a deer trail branching off a manicured trail, and I will follow it discover where it might lead me. Wandering is being open to what might show up, or what might be waiting for me.

I wonder as I wander. Wonder, at times, means awe, but I primarily use "wonder" to mean "curious." Wonder is being open to whatever might show up, or be waiting for me. It is asking the question, "I wonder what is here for me?" I will pay attention to my senses, what stirs in my body, or pops into my imagination. I will follow what shows up to see what it leads or what it stirs in me.


Walking, wandering, and wondering together is a practice to discern what is greening in the world around me, and within me. I would invite you to find ways to walk, wander, and wonder in your own unique way. I would encourage you to find a way to do this with nature, with art, and with attending to your body. Nature, art, and attending to our bodies are ways of being whole.

We are still in the season of Easter, and are experiencing and expressing fulness of Life. We began the season with Jesus' gentle breathing Spirit into the disciples, and we will end the season with the Spirit poured out with the sound of a powerful wind and flames of fire. The Spirit stirs up Life within, among, and beyond us. The Spirit is the greening and blooming of Soul and Spirit. Our Sunday gatherings will be opportunities to experience and express the bursting forth of Life individually, and collectively. The New Life breathed into us, and blowing through us is how God draws us into relationship. These remaining Sundays are our opportunity to

celebrate that "in this One we live and move and have our being."

There are three more weeks in May for this book discussion. May 7, 14, and 21


All are welcome to attend a discussion group about Julia Cameron's new book "Living the Artist's Way: An Intuitive Path to Greater Creativity".



# THE ROBERT C. AND PHYLLIS J. SIO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Robert C. and
Phyllis J. Sio Scholarship Fund has
been established to support
undergraduate education
scholarships for two students at
\$1,500 per student. The following
general guidelines shall be used
by the Emmanuel Lutheran
Scholarship Committee to
administer this fund:

- 1) The scholarship shall be used to support undergraduate education only.
- 2) The student must attend an accredited Christian college.
- 3) The scholarship is intended to support tuition expenses only.
- 4) Applicants shall be members of Emmanuel Lutheran Church and/or seniors at Christian Life High School, Rockford Christian High School or Rockford Lutheran High School.
- 5) Two separate scholarships of \$1,500 each will be awarded annually to two students.
  Grantees may receive no more than two annual scholarships.
- 6) Selections will be based on many different criteria including spiritual involvement and motivation, scholastic achievement, financial need, leadership and extra-curricular activity, strength of recommendations and quality of application materials (not necessary in that order).
- 7) A letter of notification will be sent to all applicants by the end of June.
- 8) The funds distribution will take place prior to the beginning of the grantee's fall semester and



after receiving confirmation of enrollment at the college (i.e.: class schedule).

9) Please understand that the decisions of Emmanuel Lutheran Church Council, in granting the scholarships, will be final. The scholarship is a gift and requires no repayment. Emmanuel Lutheran Church reserves the right to publish the names of scholarship recipients in the media.
