An October Message from Pastor Frank



Beloved Ones,

Emmanuel has been shaped by many people throughout - since 1882. The festival of All Saints is November 1, and Emmanuel celebrates all these people, the saints, and ancestors on the first Sunday in November. We will also celebrate the 100th anniversary of our Sanctuary and Centennial Hall. Our ReFresh Sunday gatherings in October will prepare us for the celebration of All Saints. We will celebrate four significant mentors/ancestors of Emmanuel who have been important to the spirituality of this community. Francis of Assisi and Richard Rohr, who is a Franciscan. will be the ancestral witnesses on Sunday October 1. We will hear the ancestral witness of this land's Indigenous people on Sunday October 8 in the outdoor gathering. We will have a blessing of the animals on October 8, and you are invited to bring your pets to participate in the blessing. The poet Mary Oliver will be the witness on October 15. The writings of Matthew Fox will provide focus and inspiration on Sunday October 22. The last Sunday in

October shifts to honoring our losses in preparation for the celebration of All Saints the following week. Christyn Rittenhouse will share at the time of the sermon, and we will have prayers of healing. I hope you can gather in person or on Zoom throughout October.

We could name many others who have influenced Emmanuel. We could also name people who have influenced us as individuals. Perhaps during the coming weeks, we can spend time considering who has influenced each of us. Who has been a mentor in your spiritual journey? Are they people close to you? Are there writers, or spiritual/religious leaders who have provided insights, or practices that have deepened your connection with the One in whom we live and move and have our being? My own path has been influenced by diverse witnesses, saints, and ancestors. I invite you to join me in giving thanks for all who have influenced our individual paths. I will share some of those who have touched my life in the November newsletter. If you would like to share your mentors, saints, or ancestors with those who receive this newsletter, I invite you to share their names with me and I will include them in my November newsletter article.

It was from that awareness that this ceremony and program were created.

This is a time just for you: to acknowledge what you've been through and done up to this point, wherever you are. Whether it's been 2 days, 2 months, or 2 decades, feel free to join us.

This will be a blend of group coaching and a structured support group. We will use the metaphor of a river: the near bank as 'the before time', then entering the river as the transition into 'the during time' of caregiving, and the far shore as 'the after time' (this could be due to death, recovery, or even a change in roles). We will meet in the Benson room.

The Ceremony 5-6pm



New Book for Spiritual Journeys Tuesday group 9:30 - 11:00am

We are ready to begin a new book and invite you all to join us on what we think will be an interesting read and discussion. Timothy Beal's "The Rise and Fall of the Bible: The Unexpected History of an Accidental Book" looks to "debunk the myth of the Bible's infallibility and reveal a richer and more authentic way to read it." Beal is a religious scholar and former evangelical Christian. Some of Beal's insights:

Christianity thrived for centuries without any Bible.

Early congregations used collections of scrolls; there was no official canon of scriptures and no book existed that was big enough to hold them.

There is no original Bible behind the thousands of different Bibles on the market today.

The further back we go in the Bible s history, the more versions we find. The idea of the Bible as the literal Word of God is only about a century old. Beal offers a chance to rediscover a Bible, and a faith, that is truer to its own history not a book of answers but a library of questions.



Faith Community Nurse Notes

The best way to stop Medicare fraud? Help prevent it in the first place. Follow these 3 tips to protect yourself from scammers:

- 1. If you get a call, text or email asking for your Medicare Number, don't respond. Don't give your Medicare card or Medicare Number to anyone except your doctor or people you know should have it. Remember, Medicare will never call you unprompted and ask you for your personal information.
- 2. Check your Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs) or claims statements carefully. If you see a charge for a service you didn't get or a product you didn't order (like a COVID-19 over-the-counter test), it may be fraud.
- 3. If you suspect fraud, report it at 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).
