Opening of the Heart —based on Acts 2

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

We gather this day as we have gathered before with anticipation and hope.

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

We gather this day with an openness to how the Spirit might stir among us and within us. We yearn for the stirring of the wind and fire of the Spirit

Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ...in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

As we gather there are those within our midst, on the edges of our gathering, and beyond our doors who experience and express life differently from us. We surrender to the Spirit's empowerment to speak in unfamiliar ways that touch their hearts.

Perhaps the Holy Spirit is God's way of animating the Universe, of connecting the infinite billions of molecules, of creating the One from the Many.

Hildegard of Bingen speaks of the movement of the Holy Spirit this way:
"Awakening, and re-awakening – that is all that is."

The Holy Spirit is holy energy, the energy of love. It is always there, always in motion, unfolding, emerging, becoming. As it courses along the synapses of the Universe, it creates relationships, personal and transpersonal. It is the great connector, the great communicator.

The Holy Spirit sustains, nourishes, and enhances Creation.

Through this church I have come to know I am a part of Creation, and so are you. We are connected with each other and all the other parts of Creation, animal, vegetable, mineral, Higgs bosons, and anything else inside or outside matter. The Holy Spirit brings us together through the vastness of space and time and through whatever other dimensions we don't yet know.

The Holy Spirit moves. It flows, it blows; it blazes and whispers; it creates and destroys; it comforts; it laughs; it dances. It makes patterns. It creates.

At Pentecost we are amazed by the boldness of the Holy Spirit, its rushing wind and tongues of fire.

And we are grateful for the new relationships it created that day as the diverse people began, maybe for the first time, to hear and understand each other despite their different languages.

Pentecost gave the people assembled and us gathered here today a new way to know God.

William Blake's thrilling poem, "Pentecost," puts it this way.

Unless the eye catch fire,
The God will not be seen.
Unless the ear catch fire
The God will not be heard.
Unless the tongue catch fire
The God will not be named.
Unless the heart catch fire,
The God will not be loved.
Unless the mind catch fire,
The God will not be known.

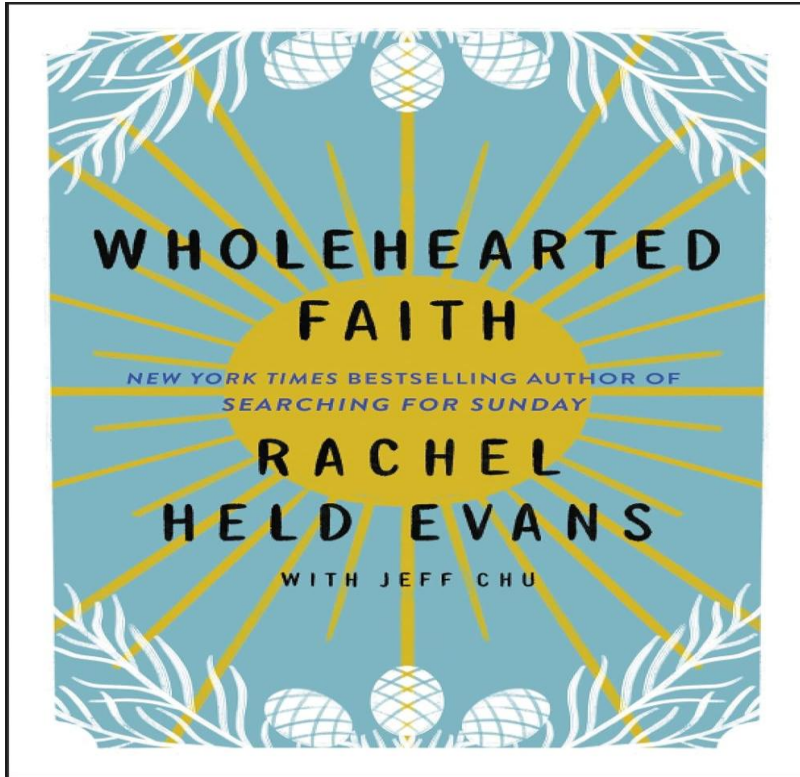
