#### **Grace and Peace**


We are immersed in nature's summer rhythm. Long before we developed clocks and calendars, nature's rhythm provided humanity with all we needed to know to experience vibrant life. Nature's rhythm is the length of daylight, warmth, and vibrancy of life. We are fully immersed in the summer's rhythms. I wonder how you experience this in your life? Do you feel it in your body, in your moods, or perhaps in some other way? What does the rhythm of summer mean for you?

June brings another shift in the rhythm of life. This is the cultural shift to the summer season. Academic calendars included no school in the summer for many generations in our country and culture. I recall that years ago people began to talk about year-round school, but that does not seem to have taken root. This cultural rhythm is persistent. Summer is a vacation and recreation time. People plan for vacations during the summer. There are summer activities including picnics, sports, and other recreational activities. Congregations have often experienced a shift the rhythm of congregational life. Programs often follow the same academic calendar, and take the summer off. I was asked recently by a colleague if things slowed down at Emmanuel during the summer. This cultural shift has provided time for different opportunities including time to relax, renew, and refresh from a slower pattern of living. I wonder how you experience this cultural shift? Do you plan to take more time for recreation, rest, and renewal during the summer? How might you be intentional about living this pattern of life? What can you do or no longer do to experience renewal?

I am wondering how the shifts in nature and in the culture influence our spirituality. Do these rhythms result in shifts in our soul dance? Winter's rhythm of resting and nesting in the warmth of shelter seems to invite us to find ways to let the roots of our souls deepen through prayerful practices. We can spend the extended night-time in reading, journaling, and other inner practices. If summer's rhythms are different, even the opposite of winter, what does that mean? I am wondering what spiritual practices might be active, and moving with an outward focus. I would like to offer a thought or a possible practice. The extended daylight hours invite activity especially outside activity. Practices that I relate to summer are community festivals, family reunions, and trips that explore new places which might include meeting new people. What if our summer spiritual practices would include exploring new practices, especially in the company of others? Can we experience our spiritual life as light, joyful, and celebrating live? Instead of reading and reflecting perhaps we can join in activities that are shared soulful experiences? Alan Roxburgh encourages people to seek where God is active in their communities, beyond their congregations. Two women found the life giving Spirit at an annual community picnic. I am wondering if we could look for God, the source of Life and Love, in community activities. We have several community festivals in June. Rockford's Pride festivities on June 2 include the parade at 11am, the Pride Party sponsored by The Office beginning at 1 pm, and an Un-Parade Party sponsored by Quiet Pride that begins at 4 PM in Inscape. Juneteenth will be celebrated on June 19, 12 PM to 9 PM, at Sinnissippi Park. We are having a Summer Solstice Ceremony on Thursday June 20, 8:15 PM at Nature At The Confluence following their Community Fire and Drum Circle which begins at 6:30. Look around and you may find the Spirit breathing and blowing through somewhere else in your neighborhood or community.



# 2024 Post Office Food Drive

The annual Post Office Food Drive was held on Saturday, May 11<sup>th</sup>. Three area post offices are involved, the Harrison Ave. PO, Loves Park PO on Windsor Rd, and the Kilburn Ave. PO. The nine Coalition pantries are stationed at each of the three post offices and receive the food as it's brought in by the mail carriers and volunteers. Emmanuel's pantry volunteers, Lorraine Harding, Barb Horn, Fran and Denny Hamm, and Kathlyn Wright were working that Saturday at the Loves Park PO, 12:30 pm to 3:00 pm, followed by Rock River Valley Pantry volunteers.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> Emmanuel's Pantry received five gaylords of food from the food drive. Five full gaylords had been weighed and the weights were averaged. The average weight of each gaylord was 815 pounds. So that is about 870 cans of food in each gaylord if all we received were standard 15-ounce cans. But we did receive a wide variety of foods and non-foods. The entire food drive received 38 gaylords of food. A little less than in previous years but still quite a bit of food.

We had a great crew of volunteers to empty all the food from the five gaylords in the truck, transport it into the pantry, get all the food out of the bags and boxes, and sort the foods into the same types. Thank you to all our volunteers, Barb Horn, Lorraine Harding, Fran and
