A scroll keeper, one who was skilled in his knowledge of tribal law, came

"Wisdomkeeper," he said, "What path must I walk to have the life of the world to come that never fades away, full of beauty and harmony?" He

answered him, "What is written in our tribal law about this? Tell me, how

do you see it?" The scroll keeper spoke from the words of the law, "You
